Source Description:

The source print, Mastiff & Lion Dog, is from *A Cabinet of Quadrupeds* by John Church, 1805. The artist is Julius Caesar Ibbetson (1759-1817) and the engraver is James Tookey (1795-1805). Notice that only the mastiff was used on the pottery.
