An invitation to a meeting of the Society of Bucks, signed "J. Evans Fecit Liverpool" meaning that Jeremiah Evans engraved it. The Society of Bucks was a Friendly Society which seems to have rivalled Freemasonry in popularity in the 1750s, but went into rapid decline after 1800. The design of

## Description:

Tin-glazed earthenware (so-called delftware) tile printed in red in Liverpool by Sadler and Green with "The Arms of the Society of Bucks" (Anthony Ray, *Liverpool Printed Tiles*, 1994, no. B1-2). The engraver was probably Jeremiah Evans, whose signature as engraver is found on porcelain printed in Liverpool by Sadler. Evans was probably newly arrived in Liverpool when he advertised in 1757: "J. Evans, engraver, *expand* [+]"
